

## Report of the BSG Research Sub-Committee 2024/5

The Research Sub-Committee (RSC) met twice during the year, in November 2024 and in March 2025. Both meetings were held online via MS Teams.

### Grant funding

A total of £35,000 is available to the RSC to fund grants in each calendar year. Two grant rounds were held across 2024/25: September 2024 (£21,000 available) and February 2025 (£20,500). Three things to note: 1) the 2024 Linton Award winner, Sanjeev Gupta, kindly donated their award money to the RSC to support ECRs – this was used to support an extra PGR conference attendance (awarded to the highest ranked application); 2) we allocated £20,000 of baseline funds instead of the usual £15,000 for the Feb 2025 round - this means the Sep 2025 allocation will be slightly reduced from £20,000 to £15,000 to balance our 2025 budget; 3) the University of Liverpool-BSG Luminescence Dating Award has been withdrawn as of September 2024. In total, 29 grants were awarded to a total value of £41,463 (overall success rate: 50.9%; 14F, 15M). The outcomes and allocations for each grant, summed for the September 2024 and February 2025 rounds, are as follows (also including success rates and gender split):

- Early Career Grant: 3 awarded, totalling £12,034 (20%; 2F, 1M)
- Research Grants: 15 awarded, totalling £22,179 (50%; 5F, 8M). This is broken down as follows:
  - Full member: 4 awarded, totalling £6,097 (36%; 1F, 3M)
  - PGR member: 11 awarded, totalling £9,930 (21%; 6F, 5M)
- PG Conference Attendance Grants: 9 awarded, totalling £16,082 (58%; 4F, 5M)
- Decolonising Geomorphology Grant: 0 applications
- Carers Grant: 1 awarded, totalling £500 (100%, 1F, 0M)
- Conference Support Grants: 1 awarded, totalling £500 (100%; 0F, 1M)

RSC members grade and rank the applications and provide detailed feedback to unsuccessful applicants. The criteria, guidance and review process for all grants are clearly outlined on the website to ensure a fair and transparent application process. The administrative load on committee members continues to be significant and we continue to monitor demand and success rates for specific schemes to tailor our funding portfolio accordingly.

There remains £15,190 available from the current budget for the September 2025 call. You must be logged in as a member to apply. ### Society Awards

In particular please give consideration to meritorious individuals from groups who may be under-represented in our discipline.
